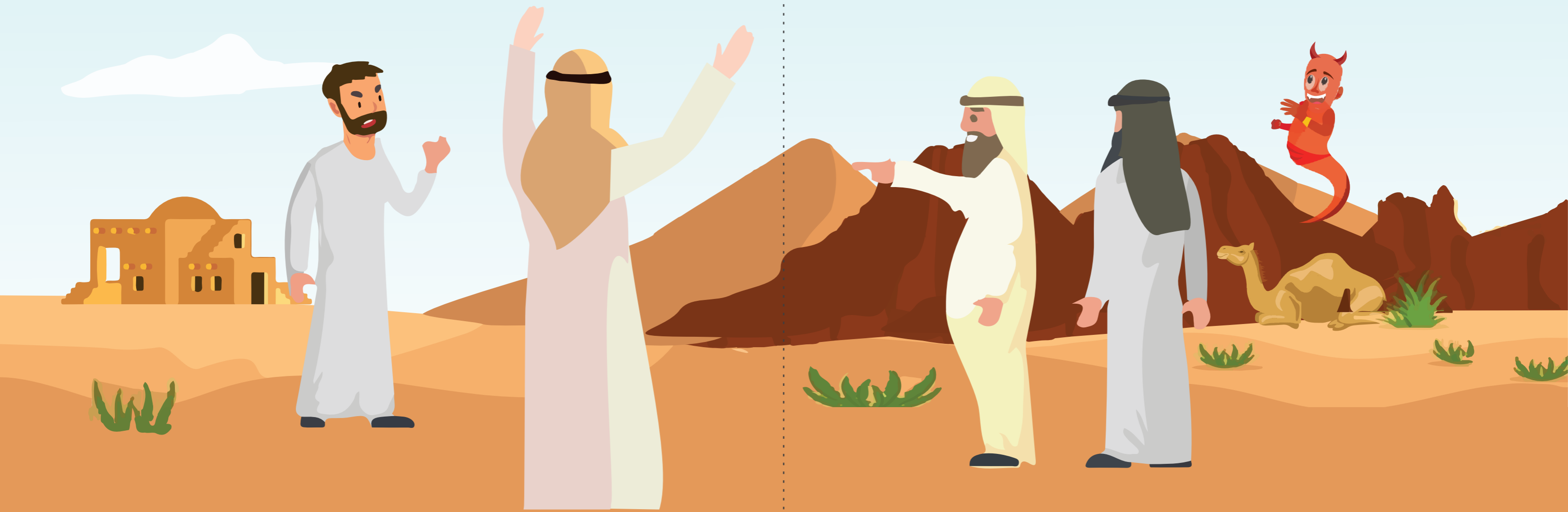
They drank the she-camel's milk, yet still did not think that this is a neh'ma directly from Allah's rehma.

## SYNOPSIS OF STORY

3. Saleh (as) was known for his wisdom, purity and goodness and was greatly respected in the community.
4. When Saleh(as) became a Prophet the people voiced their high aspirations for him and their disappointment with his preaching - Quran: Chapter 11, Verse 62.
5. They teased him, called him a mere human, a fool, accusing him of wanting money and fame.
6. They asked for proof and said provide for us a miracle requesting for a unique pregnant she-camel to come out of a rock.
7. They agreed to believe if this was to happen. Allah allowed for this miracle, yet most of them continued in their disbelief - Quran: Chapter 17, Verse 59.
8. The people of Thamud hated the she-camel and her baby yet allowed them to graze and drink freely as they wanted her milk and agreed to share the water with Salih.

9. The killers were given a hero's welcome. In their arrogance they mocked Saleh(as) but he warned them about Allah's punishment saying "Enjoy life for 3 more days then the punishment will descend upon you."
10. Saleh(as) hoped this warning would be taken seriously and they would change their ways, but instead they said "Why 3 days?...Let the punishment come as quickly as possible." Quran: Chapter 27 Verse 45-53.
11. They plotted to kill Saleh(as) and his household but Allah (swt) had His own plan.
12. Allah (swt) sent thunderbolts and a severe earthquake which destroyed the entire tribe of Thamud and its homeland. Quran: Chapter 7, Verse 73-79.
