Let us begin by saying Bismillah!






Shaytan had once again created a rift between two brothers.

He (as) was blessed with two wives who produced twelve lives for him. Yaqub (as) always prayed but some of his sons unfortunately went astray.




He was very very sad but never lost hope as with Allah (swt) did he always cope.

Our emotions should not alter our devotion, as Allah (swt) has a plan, so do not be swayed by Shaytan.






