The purpose of this book is as follows:

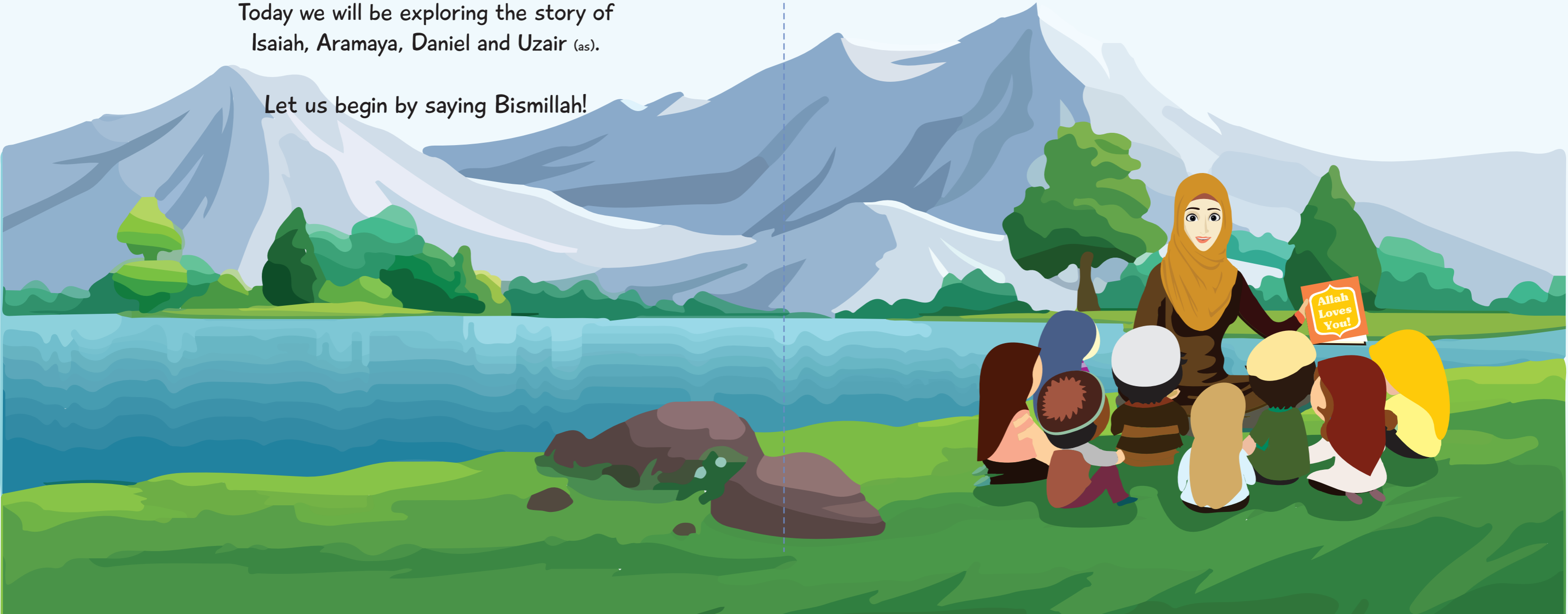
- 1 - Instill in your heart to always be connected to Allah and turn to Him for all your affairs;

The King was infected but to Allah (swt) did everyone remain connected. Allah (swt) provided the cure and with patience did they all endure.



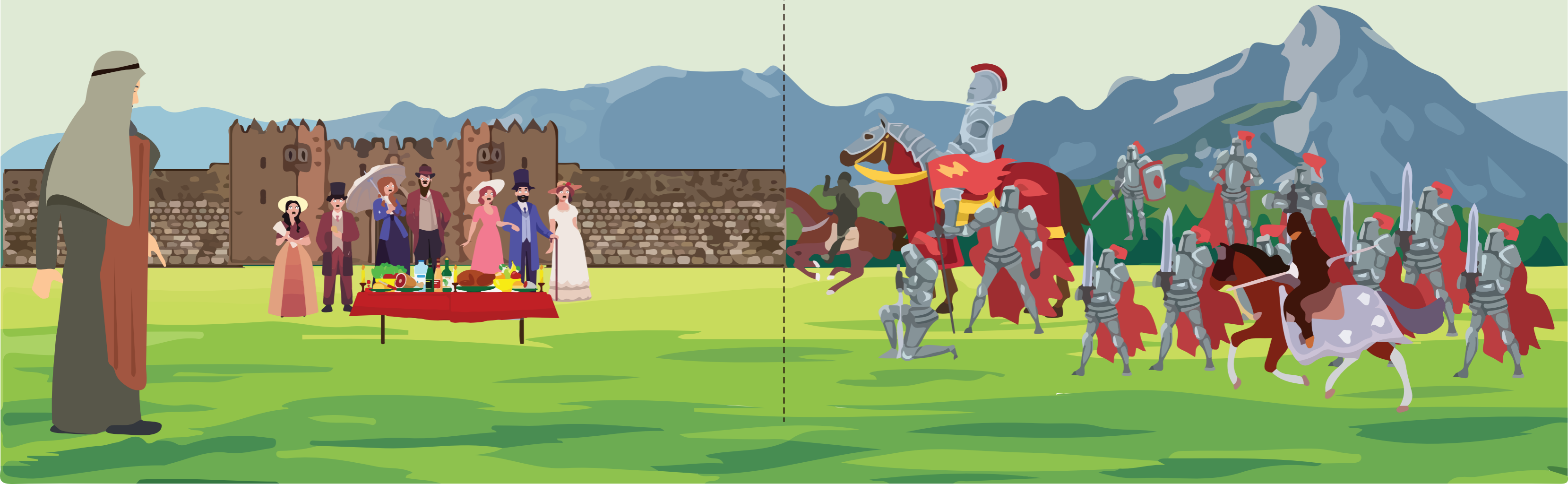
Aramaya (as) to Allah (swt) was very lovable

him a punishment so dire.



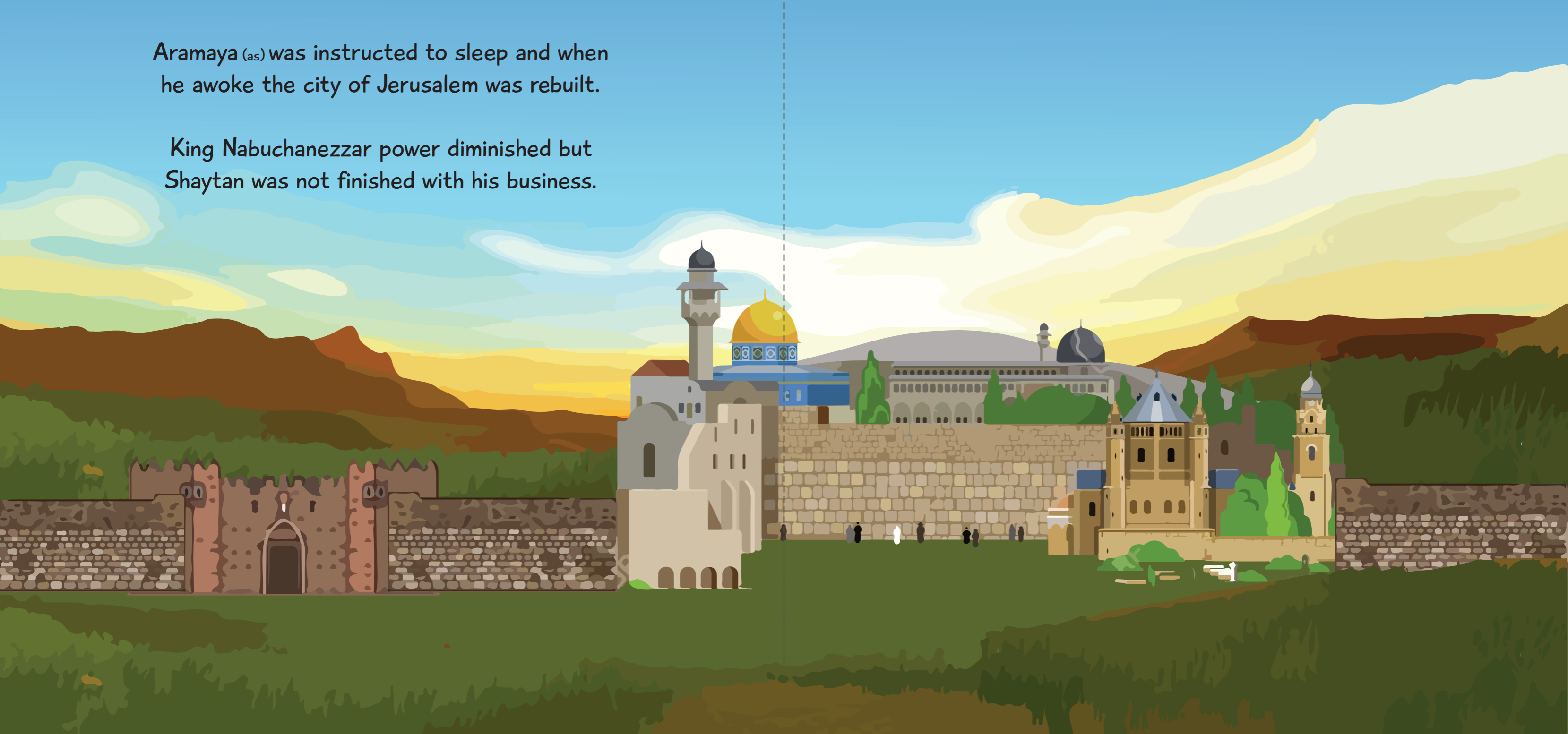
King Nabuchadnezzar was like no other warrior.

King Nabuchanezzar power diminished but Shaytan was not finished with his business.



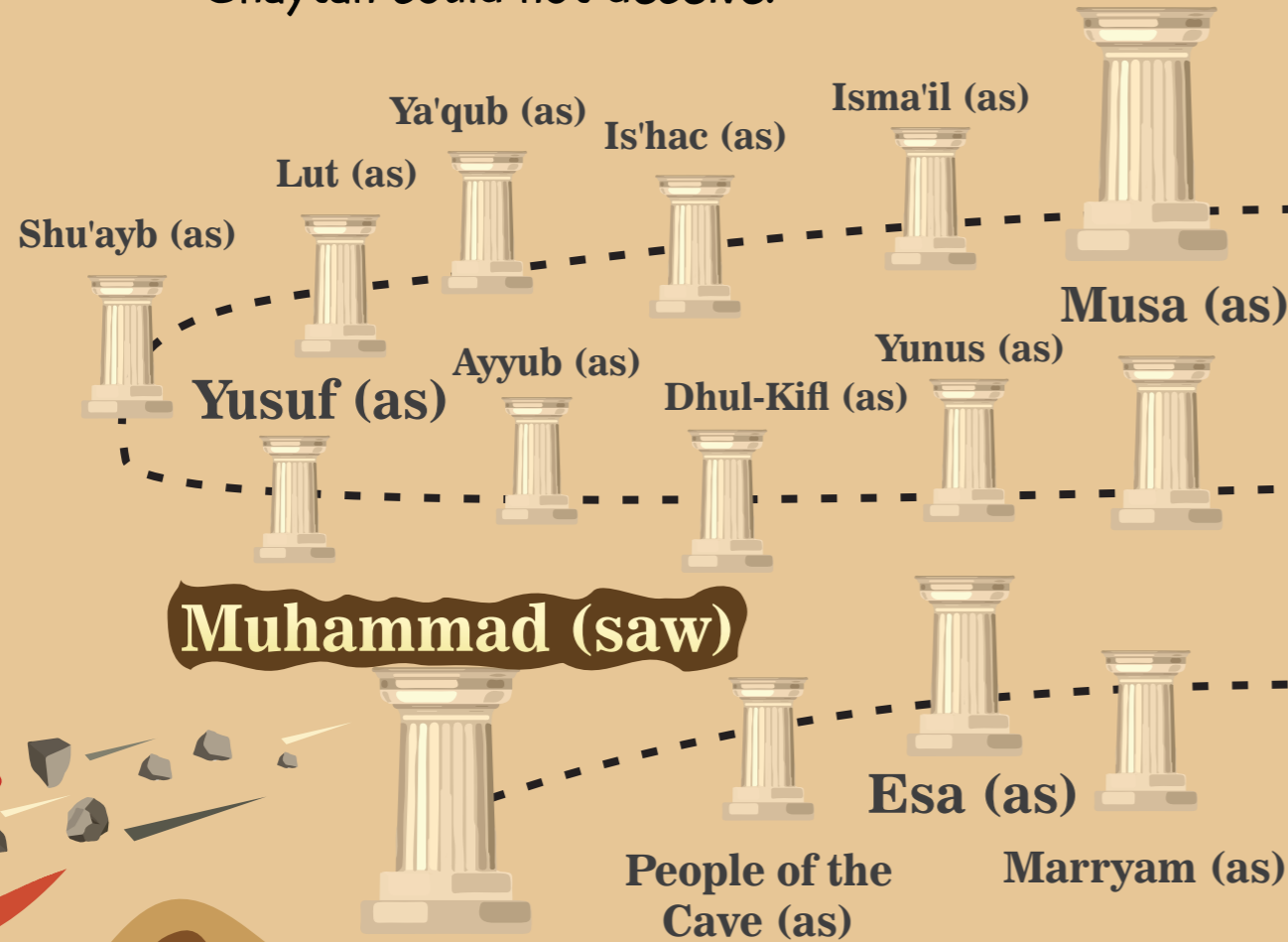
Daniel ^(as) was placed in a pit with two lions in a ring, by none other than the King.

The lions were in Allah's ^(swt) submission and did not have permission to hurt the prophet Daniel ^(as).

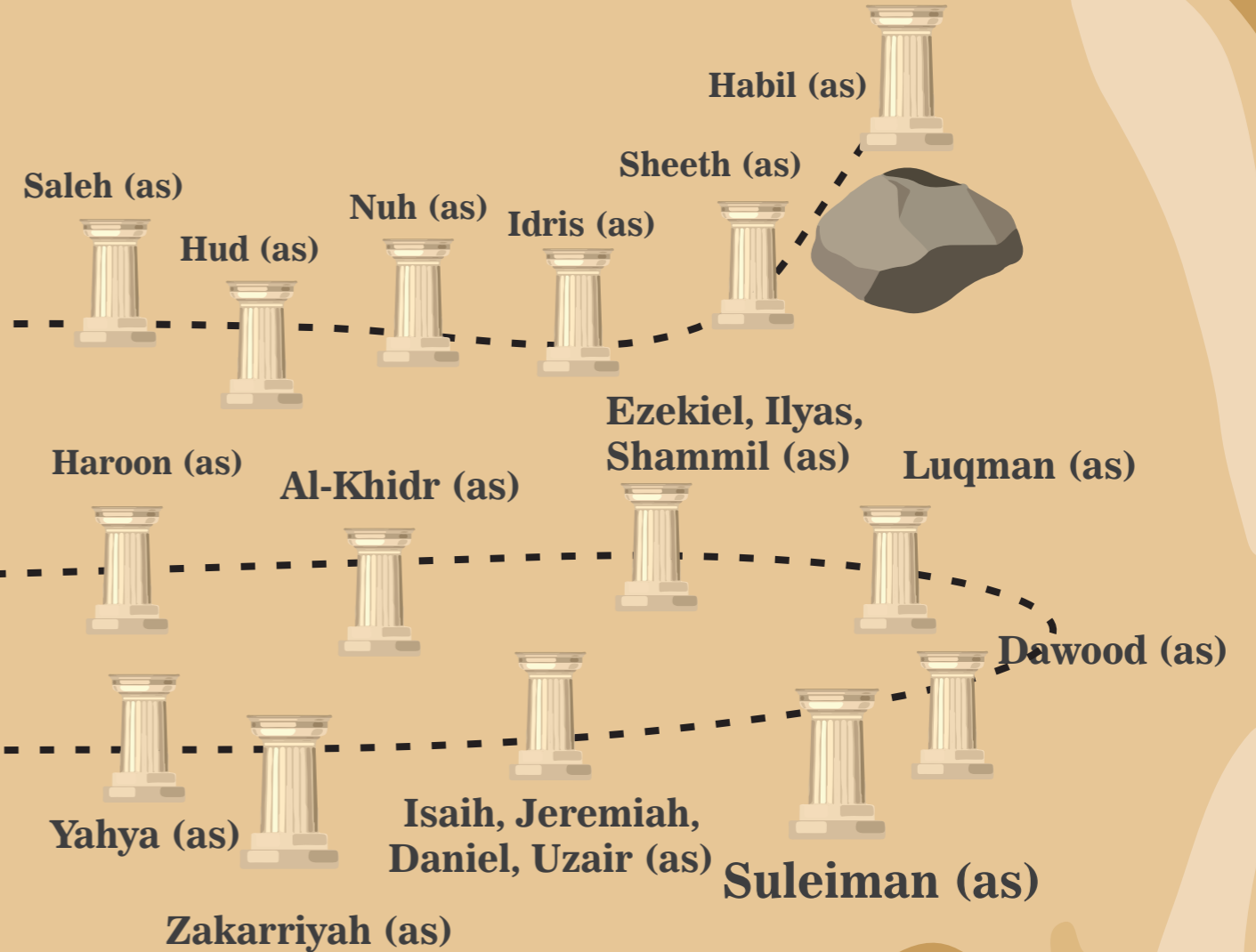


Every prophet is reliable as their trust in Allah (swt) is so very viable. They truly believed and Shaytan could not deceive.

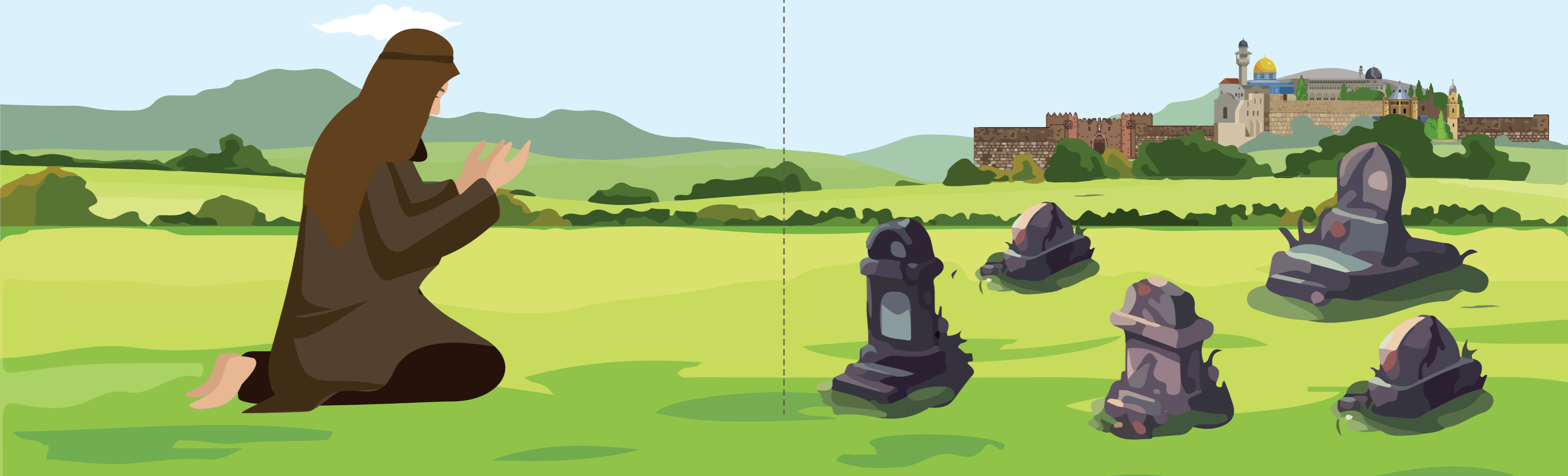
Just out of curiosity though, Uzair (as) asked about resurrection.

SYNOPSIS OF STORY

Isaiah (as)

6. King Hezekiah passed away and the condition of the Israelites deteriorated as there was political confusion and their wickedness increased.
